



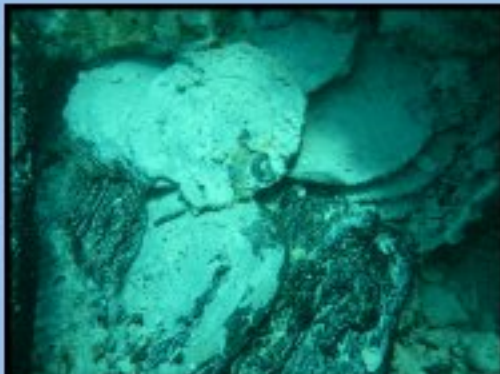

## Pewter Expert & Historian Martin Roberts Helps GME Prepare for Upcoming Auction

When you find over 100 complete place settings of rare 16th century pewter, the collecting world takes notice. In an effort to better understand what we had and how to best approach this collector market, GME enlisted pewter expert Martin Roberts. Martin hails from England and has recently spent several weeks with GME staff training them how to prepare the pewter artifacts for auction.

Through a meticulous polishing process, GME's collection of fine pewter has been restored to the original mirror-like finish. This luster was responsible for pewter being nicknamed "Poor Mans Silver". GME conservators have prepared and documented over 225 artifacts for this historic auction. The recovery has been hailed as the single largest cache of 16th century pewter ever discovered and excitement is building in anticipation of the event. More details to follow.
